

Master of Management (Finance)

Recommended Study Plan - MC-MGMTFIN (16 subject program - 200 points)

The Master of Management (Finance) 16 subject program consists of 5 foundation subjects (3 foundation subjects and 1 constrained-choice foundation subject to be completed in the first semester of study, and 1 constrained-choice foundation subject to be completed in the second semester of study), 3 discipline core subjects, 3 finance elective subjects, 4 general elective subjects, and 1 capstone subject to be taken in the final semester of study.

Students entering the course with 50 points of advanced standing should refer to the study plan for the 150 point version of the program.
