5 x Foundation Subjects



Foundation subjects must be completed before advancing to compulsory finance subjects

3 x Core Finance Subjects

1 x Capstone Subject

3 x Finance Electives

4 x General Electives

*Financial Management* (FNCE90060) is a prerequisite for all other finance subjects!

# PROGRAM STRUCTURE - 12 SUBJECT PROGRAM



1 x Foundation Subject  
To be completed in semester 1

3 x Core Finance Subjects  
1 x Capstone Subject

4 x Finance Electives  
3 x General Electives

## ADDITIONAL REQUIRED SUBJECTS

Students in the 150 point (12 subject) program who have not completed prior studies equivalent to any (one) of the following foundation subjects are required to complete that subject in their first semester of study:

ACCT90004 Accounting for Decision Making,  
ECOM90009 Quantitative Methods for Business or;  
ECON90005 Managerial Economics.

If you are required to take one of these subjects, it will be noted in your letter of offer for the program.

This subject will be credited towards your program as a general elective.

If your letter of offer does not list a required subject, you should follow the recommended study plan for your first semester.

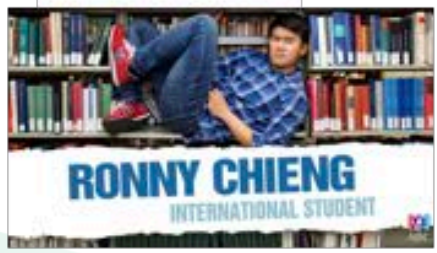
