

Graduate Diploma in Finance

Recommended Study Plan – GD-FIN (8 subject program – 100 points)

The Diploma consists of 8 semester-length subjects comprising 5 discipline core subjects and 3 elective subjects.

Please note: FNCE90056 Investment Management and FNCE90018 Corporate Financial Policy take the place of elective subjects within the Graduate Diploma in Finance, and are only available to students who have been judged to have not studied this content as part of their undergraduate degree.
